## **Matching Worksheet**

## Huitzilopochtli

The Aztec god of war, the sun and sacrifice. His name is thought to mean "left-handed hummingbird". He was often drawn with feathers and holding a scepter made from a snake

#### Chicomecoatl

Chicomecoatl was the Aztec goddess of agriculture, nourishment and corn. She was often drawn as a young girl carrying flowers or a woman using the sun as a shield. Her name meant "seven snakes".

### **Ogmios/Ogma**

Ogmios is the Celtic god of eloquence. Ogmios has long chains attached to his tongue that connect him with his group of followers, symbolizing the power of eloquence and persuasion to bind his followers to him. Ogmios' later Irish equivalent *Ogma* is credited as being the inventor of Ogham – the earliest system of writing in Ireland

#### **Epona**

Epona was the Celtic goddess of horses. The goddess is shown surrounded by horses (which she sometimes feeds).

#### **Anubis**

Anubis is the Egyptian Protector of the Dead. Anubis is shown as a jackal-headed man, or as a jackal. He was associated with mummification and as protector of the dead. It was Anubis who conducted the deceased to the hall of judgment.

#### Hathor

Hathor was the Egyptian goddess of women, beauty, and music. She can be depicted as a woman wearing the headdress of a cow's horns. where she holds the solar disc between her horns.



















## **Fiction Starters: 290 World Religions**
